Sometimes the normal processes of cell growth, death, and regulation get completely <u>deranged</u>. Cells are transformed and begin robbing their neighbors' blood supply, like vampires. They defy normal limitations on growth, multiply unceasingly, and then invade space reserved for others. They refuse to die on schedule. These are cancer cells, and they are responsible for about two million new cases of various cancers that occur every year in the United States, and over half a million deaths. One out of five people in industrialized countries will die of cancer, most of them from tumors that originated in a lung, breast, prostate gland, colon, or rectum. In an early 19th-century best seller, a famous food writer offered a cure for obesity and chronic disease: a low-carbohydrate diet. The notion that what you eat shapes your medical fate has had a strong influence throughout history. 47 For many Americans, it is more a canon than a principle to suggest that what you eat affects your health. Accordingly, they believe that you control your own destiny and that it is never too late to reinvent yourself. 48 If not, you get healthy.
